




Sounds of the Symphony

The second concert of our 2019–2020 season celebrates a fairy tale, a commanding trumpet solo, and a perennial holiday favorite. It is a contrast of musical styles and energy that will amaze and delight us.

German composer Engelbert Humperdinck's 19th Century opera, *Hansel and Gretel*, is taken from the Grimm Brothers' fairy tale. The opera first debuted in Germany on December 23, 1893 under the baton of Richard Strauss and has long been associated with Christmas. The Overture delights us with lush melodies, the playful


sounds of childhood, feelings of nostalgia – the magical feeling of a fairy tale.

A very different kind of sound follows with Johann Nepomuk Hummel's challenging Trumpet Concerto in E-flat major. The concerto was originally written in E major for Viennese trumpet virtuoso and inventor of the keyed trumpet, Anton Weidinger. The demanding piece was later written in E-flat major to make it more

compatible with newer trumpets. Following a spirited Allegro, the trumpet soloist plays against humming violins in the Andante.

Alternating, contrasting themes mark the closing, vigorous Rondo, which is replete with the soloist's technically demanding trills and flourishes, before a triumphant finale.

Selections from Tchaikovsky's



perennial holiday favorite, *The Nutcracker Ballet*, will close the concert and send us away in the spirit of the season. We are invited to give ourselves up to the music and adventures of Clara as we listen to the March of the Toy Soldiers, Waltz of the Flowers, Dance of the Sugar Plum Fairy, and of course, the lively diversion of the dances and lyrical music.








SOLOIST

Tristan Clarke is Principal Trumpet for both the Jacksonville Symphony and The Coastal Symphony of Georgia. With the Trumpet Concerto, Tristan turns to his first love, classical trumpet music. The concerto is challenging, but Tristan is looking forward to playing it for us. "I've had so many life changing experiences with music, and all I could ask for is to share them with others," he says. Tristan studied at the Peabody Institute, completed his Bachelor's degree at Julliard, has played with the Atlanta, Charlotte, and Boston symphonies, and worked with leading musicians including Itzhak Perlman and Leonard Slatkin.



PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

While we look forward with anticipation to the December 2 concert, our Music Director/Conductor Michelle Merrill is already preparing for the 2020-2021 season. Performance selections are made by the end of January 2020, and musicians are put under contract. We are always busy behind the scenes at the Coastal Symphony of Georgia!

The number of musicians needed for each concert enters into the music selection process, as all four programs must fall within the annual budgetary constraints while meeting the conductor's interpretation of the pieces. Some pieces require a large, full orchestra, while others need a smaller ensemble to convey beautiful music. This year our number of musicians ranges from 32 for the March 2020 concert to 71 for Opening Night in September 2019.

Please take a moment to peruse the Concert Notes and Meet the Composers sections of the Season Program where you will find insight into the composers' ideas when creating their pieces. In fact, if you haven't done so already, please do take your Season Program home with you at the next concert. It is intended to be part of your concert experience, allowing you to come into the concert hall informed of the night's performance.

I look forward to seeing you at the December concert, which will offer a powerful trumpet solo and the sounds of the Christmas season!


