EMOTIONS

The concert opens with 20th Century Austrian composer, Anton Webern's *Langsamer Satz*, a work inspired by a hiking trip in Lower Austria. A luscious work for strings, it expresses a plethora of emotions from yearning to dramatic turmoil to a tranquil peaceful denouement.


Current American composer Quinn Mason's shimmering *Princesa de la Luna* for harp and strings will enchant us with its blend of tradition and innovation. The concerto is full of imagery of moonlit nights, celestial elegance, and a touch of magic which Mason combines to contrast with a strong, modern feel.



Next, J. S. Bach transports us back to a Baroque salon with his *Oboe d'amore Concerto*. It has been called a cheerful, enticing work that makes happy and heals the heart. Reworked from a concerto for harpsichord into an oboe concerto with strings, the work

shows Bach's mastery in incorporating the oboe into his compositions.

The concert will close with 20th Century composer Dimitri Shostakovich's powerful and deeply personal Chamber Symphony. It was written for quartet in three days after he reluctantly joined the communist party and later transcribed for chamber orchestra. There is a sense of urgency throughout the symphony performed in five interconnected movements, suggesting Shostakovich's internal struggle with the political realities surrounding him.

NOVEMBER CONCERT SOLOIST

PRINCIPAL OBOE, DANIEL RIOS

Our soloist for the November concert is Daniel Rios, Clarence Heagy Principal Oboe Chair for the Coastal Symphony of Georgia. Daniel is also Second Oboe/English Horn with the Jacksonville Symphony which he joined in 2017. He has been a member of the San Antonio Symphony, now the San Antonio Philharmonic, the Wichita Symphony, the Tulsa Opera, and the Boston and Los Angeles Philharmonic orchestras.



Daniel is very excited to be performing the Bach *Oboe d'amore Concerto*. "It is not often performed, but I think it is one of the finest solo pieces for any of the wind instruments," he says. "The slow movement is particularly special, and the last movement is pure joy!" The oboe d'amore is larger than the oboe but smaller than the English horn. Since he plays all three instruments, Daniel says his biggest challenge in preparing for this performance is balancing his time practicing and making reeds for his instruments.

Hailing from San Antonio, Texas, Daniel studied at the New England Conservatory in Boston, the Cleveland Institute of Music, and the Oberlin Conservatory. He performs chamber music with a variety of performers around the country, and as a guest musician with orchestras nationwide.

Daniel lives in Jacksonville with his wife, violinist Megan McClendon Rios, their young son and daughter, and the family dog Emmylou. He immediately points to Beethoven's music as a large part of why he became a musician, but notes it is almost impossible to pick a favorite composer.


